



NCCJ of the Piedmont Triad’s statement on voters’ approval of Amendment One, May 8, 2012:

“Creating a sea change in people’s thinking does not happen overnight, or even over a few short months. We may have lost this vote, but we have moved the needle significantly. In a time of such intense partisan politics and divisiveness in North Carolina and across the country, NCCJ is proud to have worked with a grassroots coalition across political parties and faith traditions. Campaigning against this amendment, we have built and strengthened alliances with a broad and diverse group of partners. This is the real victory.

“We felt it strongly this past Sunday when we saw Mt. Zion Baptist Church fill with people of all races, religious traditions and sexual orientations. We talked about loving and not judging our neighbors. We talked about standing up to those who seek to divide our community’s vote and perpetrate hate. These are monumental steps in our community towards dialogue. Thousands of people have been mobilized and engaged in building a more just community, work that doesn’t stop on May 8.
